COTTONWOOD FIRE AREA)

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SIERRA ORDAINS as follows:

Ordinance Section One: As an Urgency Ordinance, Part 11, Chapter 06, Section 080 of the Sierra County Code is hereby added to read as follows:

CHAPTER 11.06 - ROAD USE AND MAINTENANCE

11.06.080 Emergency Closure of Roads within Cottonwood Fire Area

11.06.085 Exemptions from Emergency Road Closure

11.06.080 Emergency Closure of Roads Within Cottonwood Fire Area

The following roads within the Cottonwood Fire Area are hereby closed:

- (a) Lemon Canyon Road (County Road 650) from a point 2 miles east of its intersection with Campbell Hot Springs Road to its junction with Henness Pass Road, for a total length of 9.3 miles.
- (b) Bear Valley Road (County Road 451) from the edge of pavement (located one half mile southwest of its intersection with Smithneck Road) in a southeasterly direction to its intersection with Lemon Canyon Road, for a total length of 5 miles.
- (c) Badenaugh Road (County Road 560) for its entire length, a total of 6.8 miles.
- (d) Antelope Valley Road (County Road 855) from the edge of pavement (located one half mile southwest of its intersection with Smithneck Road) for 2 miles in a southwesterly direction.
- (e) Smithneck Road (County Road 860) from the edge of pavement (approximately 5 miles south from its intersection with State Highway 49) for 5 miles to a point approximately one half mile south of its intersection with Trosi Canyon Road (commonly referred to as "Summit One"). Smithneck Road shall remain closed Mondays through Saturdays, and shall be open only on Sundays, which Sundays have a sign posted indicating that Smithneck Road is open.

11.06.085 Exemptions from Emergency Road Closure


The road closures set forth in Part 11, Chapter 06, Section 080 subsection (a) through (e) do not apply to legitimate governmental or administrative agencies, private contractors under valid permits, and private property owners or their authorized agents whose property is accessed by the closed roads.

Ordinance Section Two: This ordinance shall be an urgency ordinance, effective upon adoption, and is necessary for the immediate public protection from the high volume of truck traffic necessitated by salvage logging operations and other fire rehabilitation work, and for the protection of the fire-damaged properties from vandalism and theft.

Introduced and passed and adopted at a regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Sierra, State of California, held on the 5th day of July, 1995, by the following roll call vote, to-wit:


