

CALIFORNIA RABIES CONTROL PROGRAM

DOG LICENSE INFORMATION

Dog licensing is mandated by the State of California Health and Human Services Department. The licensing is required to ensure all dogs have been properly vaccinated against rabies. All counties within the State of California have been declared "rabies areas" for 2007. This is based on the ongoing cycles of rabies in California's wildlife, and the resulting threat of exposure to domestic animals, livestock, and humans.

The owner of every dog over the age of four months shall ensure that their pet is currently vaccinated for rabies and licensed. Dogs less than four months of age shall be confined at home or kept under close leash supervision by the owner.

- A rabies vaccination certificate must be presented with any dog license application.
- Sierra County Ordinance requires licensing of all dogs four months old or older.
- One, Two, or Three year licenses are available. They must coincide with your rabies vaccination expiration date.
- LICENSING FEES ARE WAVED FOR SENIOR CITIZENS 65 YEARS AND OLDER

ONE YEAR male / female	\$15.00
ONE YEAR male- neutered / female- spayed	\$10.00
TWO/THREE YEAR male / female	\$23.00
TWO/THREE YEAR male- neutered / female- spayed	\$14.00
